



CE Marking of Batteries

CE certification of electrical/electronic devices relates to electromagnetic compatibility (EMC). The certifications and tests related to this are designed to ensure that electromagnetic radiation (which are really radio waves) from components do not interfere with other devices such as TV, radios, computers, medical equipment and mobile phones.

Types of devices that do not radiate electromagnetic radiation, such as batteries, are not required to undergo the tests. However, many Asian battery manufacturers have been persuaded by various testing organizations that they should be tested and this is why you will see the CE mark on so many Chinese batteries.

We as a company decided not to include this marking on our batteries because it is not necessary and it is misleading.
